If able we stand to say or sing:

Glory to God in the highest and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,

You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

A Collect for Creationtide.

We sit while a sermon is preached and then stand to reaffirm our faith.

Affirmation of Faith

We say together in faith:

All Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come.

We believe in God the Father, who created all things: for by his will they were created and have their being.

We believe in God the Son who was slain, for with his blood he purchased us for God from every tribe and language, from every people and nation.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit. The Spirit and the Bride say 'Come'. Even so, come Lord Jesus! Amen.

Prayers of Intercession

These or other intercessions are offered.

Let us pray for our own needs and for the needs of others, following the pattern which Jesus gave when he taught us to pray to God our Father.

Through our love of the countryside, through our care for commuters and farmers, through our care for animals and wildlife, through our respect for property and tools:

All Father, hallowed be your name.

On our farms and in our homes, in our colleges and schools, where machinery is made, and where policy is planned:

All Father, your kingdom come.

By our seeking your guidance, by our keeping your commandments, by our living true to our consciences:

All Father, your will be done.

For the millions who live in poverty and hunger, for our own needs, and the requirements of our neighbours, by cooperation, sympathy and generosity:

All give us today our daily bread.

Because we have broken your commandments, doing what we ought not to do and failing as good stewards of your creation;

All forgive us our sins.

If any have injured us by injustice, double dealing or exploitation:

All we forgive those who sin against us.

When prosperity lulls us to false security, or hard times prompt us to despair, When success makes us boastful,

or failure makes us bitter:

All lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

In the assurance of faith, in the confidence of hope, in the will to serve, help us to love Christ as Lord, and our neighbour as ourselves:

All for the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.

Preparation of the Table

The Priest takes the bread and wine:

As the grain once scattered in the fields and the grapes once dispersed on the hillside are now reunited on this table in bread and wine, so Lord, may your whole Church soon be gathered together from the corners of the earth into your kingdom.

All Amen.

The Lord is here.

All His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, Lord God, our light and our salvation, to you be glory and praise for ever.

From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise. In the fullness of time, you made us in your image the crown of all creation.

You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna, in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, in the highest.

How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord. As a mother tenderly gathers her children, you embraced a people as your own. When they turned away and rebelled your love remained steadfast.

From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary, to be the living bread, in whom all our hungers are satisfied.

He offered his life for sinners, and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross, we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand.

Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory.

Bring us at the last with St Cuthbert, St Mark and all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

All Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

Let us pray for the coming of God's kingdom, in the words that Christ has taught us:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Giving of Communion

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

All We do not presume to come to this your table, merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table.

But you are the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

We receive communion; We reply 'Amen' when given bread.

Prayers after Communion

Post Communion Prayer.

All Lord of all creation, as we have received the bread and wine, fruits of the earth and tokens of salvation, so with joy we celebrate your goodness and commit ourselves to serve you on your earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
